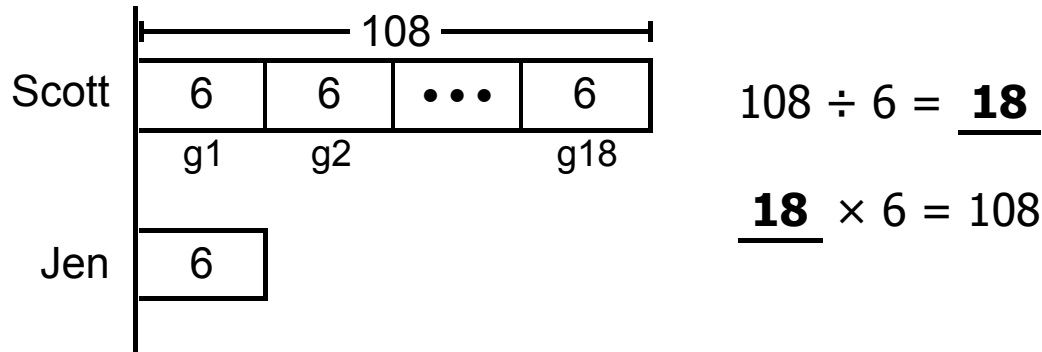


- A. Scott picks 108 apples.
